The competition will deeply discuss about technology that is adaptable with the current trend, character, and needs in managing future workforce and aims to harmonize communication, connection, network, and interaction between individual and corporations.

The students would be able to interact with Managers, Employees, Union Leaders and Stakeholders on relevant HR-IR themes. We welcome you to encourage your students (guided by faculty / heads of the institutions) to participate in Industrial Projects Competition that goes beyond classroom study of management.

Winning teams and their institutes would be presented with trophies and certificate(s) by February 2022.

Learning Objectives:

The competition is designed to enable students of management to get hands on experience through live projects on contemporary topics in the area of Human Resource Management in New normal including Industrial relations with Industry 4.0. in Manufacturing and Service sectors.

At the end of the project students would learn to:

- 1) Formulate project questions and objectives on the selected topic.
- 2) Generate, observe and document primary data on work-place practices.
- 3) Conceptualize findings based on field data from structured interviews, survey etc.
- 4) Communicate the experiences, data, and conclusions through written reports and PPT presentations.
- 5) Make live presentation with innovative modes such as debate, role play, skit, posters etc before a team of experts from Industry and Academics.

The Design:

Students are expected to work in teams of at least three to six members with a faculty guide and engage themselves with a HR-IR theme of their choice and its application in different work organizations from industrial, services and Non Profit Organization sectors.

Given below are recommended topics for MCCIA 2021-22 Inter Institute Industrial Projects Competition for Management Students. Teams are expected to select one of the themes and communicate to MCCIA before they begin the work.

Recommended Topics:

- 1. Big Data Analytics for HR effectiveness
- 2. The skilling needs of Pune Industry Expectations of Industry and Labour. (Manufacturing ,Hospitality , IT).
- 3. Impact of Labour reformation on industry.
- 4. Rising to the Challenges of the Future Workplace
- 5. HR: Is it missing the Human Touch?
- 6. Towards Creating a High-Performance Culture

Assessment:

Field projects *are assessed* on the basis of learning objectives mentioned above. Teams would first submit a) written report and b) later make 15+5 minute live presentation before a panel of Jury and other participating teams.

Teams are expected to use variety of methods of presentations, like debate, role play, documentary, story etc since the data /analysis is already given in the written report submitted to the jury in advance.

Your Action:

We appeal to the Directors / Heads of the institutions / Departments to personally ask their students to participate in this learning event to improve their Industry acceptability and face campus placements with confidence. Kindly assign a faculty to supervise the team in field study. The Chamber can help the participating institutes by providing select data base of HR / IR fraternity and a general recommendation letter to industry in case required.
